## Introducing Big Creative Academy

*Our next Get Together is being held at Big Creative's new site on Clifton Avenue (the former Willowfield School site). Principal Sacha Corcoran gives us some background on the Walthamstow based creative school.*

Big Creative Academy is a ground-breaking 16-19 school for excellence in creative arts. We have 're-imagined education' and aspire to be regarded by young people, parents and employers as one of the leading providers in London. We have an innovative approach fusing character and vocational education. The Academy is industry-focused meeting the skills requirements of employers and our students bridge the skills gap in creative industries, an economy in the UK of £81bn.

Our students are our greatest asset. They have won national talent competitions, one is signed to Sony Records and students have collaborated in performances with the Barbican. Half of our graduates progressing to higher education are the first in their family to go to university, many from disadvantaged backgrounds. The Academy has an ethos of wellbeing promoting character education for students and positive psychology throughout our staff team. We invite the community to join us in our journey.



## William Morris Ward flourishing from the WMBL Community Chest

Back in May we opened the second round of funding under WMBL's community chest and invited residents and groups to apply for funding of up to £500. "I love the community chest as it enables residents and small groups to try out new ideas to improve the spaces around them," says Angela Rouse, one of the WMBL Partnership members. "Our funding criteria are relatively broad and easy to meet if you are genuinely interested in doing something for the people or spaces around you. This means that the ideas that people submit are wide-ranging and really creative. To date we have approved funding for the set-up of a resident group, several street parties, Asian poetry evenings, a feasibility study for a green wall at a school, grime music sessions, weaving and drumming events, and much more. I can't wait to see what submissions we get for future rounds!" We'll be inviting some of the people that we have funded to share some of their stories from the projects at our forthcoming Get Together on the 13th September. There'll also be the chance to speak with us about how to go about applying for funding for future rounds.

## Community Chest Spotlight - MovE17

Community Dance Group MovE17 received funding from WM Big Local to run a series of dance classes for all abilities to learn the iconic dance piece *Rosas danst Rosas*. The piece was composed in the 1980's by Belgian choreographer Anne Teresa de Keersmaecker and though well known in the dance world was brought to main stream attention in 2011 when Beyoncé was accused of 'borrowing' it in the music video for her song *Countdown*. Clare Farrow, Director of MovE17 chose the piece because it is straight forward to learn, yet enough of a challenge, and is visually effective whether performed by just a few or by many people all at once. Clare taught the piece to over 30 local people over a series of dance classes at Gnome House and merged some of her existing class members with new recruits.



The whole class then performed *Rosas danst Rosas* at the Walthamstow Garden Party on the 'News from Nowhere' stage and a second time in front of the William Morris Gallery. After the event Clare was delighted with the whole experience saying: "Learning the piece has brought local residents together and they created a dance company. The performances went brilliantly and we were all very excited and proud to have taken part. It was a great experience for all"

## Kids learn how to use 'proper' tools with Blackhorse Workshop

Over the summer local children aged 8-13 have been learning how to create useful things at the Make Stuff Club with Blackhorse Workshop. Every Wednesday in August expert makers at the workshop have been running sessions with the children showing them how to make toolboxes, a samba drum and even a fortress made out of all sorts of materials! The kids have had hands on experience using the workshop tools and learnt all sorts of techniques they haven't yet been shown in school. When creating toolboxes in the first session kids really enjoyed using the pillar drill to make holes and then screwing the pieces together. They also learned how to cut wood, make wood joints as well as sanding and assembly.

Funded by William Morris Big Local the Make Stuff Club has been an initiative to help connect expert makers with the rest of the community and to provide a high quality activity for local kids. Harriet Warden, Creative Director at Blackhorse Workshop said "we've loved the opportunity to bring kids to the workshop and open up the world of making to them."



Meanwhile Blackhorse Workshop has just opened a new installation on Forest Road opposite Blackhorse Tube station. The installation is called 'Sideshow' and will have a series of workshops, exhibitions and a giant interactive marble run built from salvaged bus components!
