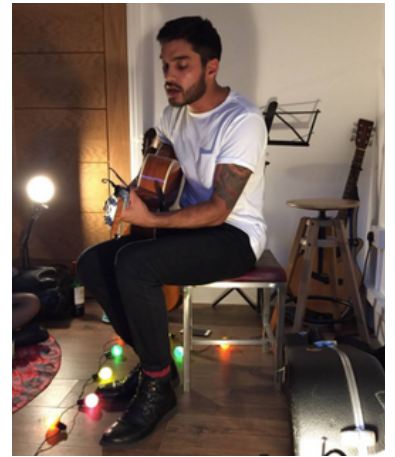

It's back! Our popular Community Chest grant scheme has returned for the autumn and the application process has never been easier. You could land up to £750 to kick start a community project or give a cash boost to an already existing project. The Community Chest grant is available for activities and events that bring people together and help community wellbeing. Projects can take shape in many different ways whether via sports, art, music, or by celebrating a significant festivity. Since its launch in 2016 our Community Chest has funded over 100 projects with the involvement of 250+ volunteers and benefited over 3000 people. Games Club finds Salvation!

Launched in early 2018, our Games Club's aim was to rediscover the fun of playing table top games in a relaxed and friendly environment for adults of all ages. Of course we didn't have a monopoly on the concept but we wanted to encourage residents to bring their old favourites for people to learn and share – in effect for our members to articulate what they wanted to play. Fast forward to 2020 and the Games Club was a victim of the pandemic.

During this difficult period it felt like we were all at risk of losing our marbles. We had to wait until autumn 2021 to relaunch the Games Club and the Salvation Army on Forest Road became a regular home for it.

Since the relaunch, membership has really taken off with laughter and the good times coming back. Often you'll find three or four different games going on in the room at the same time. On the 12th September we handed over the running of the games club to Salvation Army who have kindly taken it on for the future and made it a permanent offering. So do come along and check it out on a Tuesday afternoon, you'll be ensured a warm welcome and free refreshments are provided!

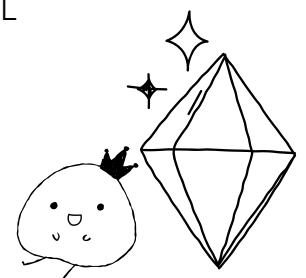


COMPETITION TIME!

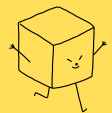

Imagine a vibrant urban garden that thrives vertically, with lush green canopies of edible plants stretching towards the sky. Welcome to the world of Vertical Polycultures, a unique community project that's taking root right here in Walthamstow thanks to the imagination of designer Daniele Di Paolo and funding from WM Big Local.

What's a Vertical Polyculture?

Vertical Polycultures are living sculptures that combine sustainable agriculture with the artistry of wickerwork. These stunning structures, woven from willow, host a variety of companion plants that work together in harmony. From delicious vegetables to beautiful flowers, these living gardens are a testament to nature's resilience and our connection to it.

Get Involved - join the project!

Whether you're passionate about nature, eager to learn, or simply looking for a unique community experience, there's a place for you in the Vertical Polycultures project. You don't need to be a gardening expert or a seasoned weaver to participate; everyone is welcome. In winter 2023 we'll be forming four groups to design and build four Vertical Polycultures around Walthamstow. By summer 2024 expect to be already enjoying produce grown on these structures!

We Support our Local Team - Walthamstow Football Club!

With all of the hype and attention around the English Premier League you'd be forgiven for not knowing that Walthamstow has its very own Football Club which so happens to be the second oldest club in London!

Initially founded as Leyton FC in 1868, the club has undergone various incarnations over the years and became Walthamstow FC in 2018. They play in the Isthmian League Division One North which features regional semi-professional clubs and is the 8th tier of the football league pyramid.

The club also plays in the F.A Cup, F.A Trophy and lower league equivalents of the League Cup which all makes for an exciting season for the 'Stow'.

Unlike top flight games, you can buy a ticket at the turnstile on matchday and then stand or sit where you like. Standing allows you to get so close to the action - you can hear the players calling out to their teammates and can hear every crunching tackle! Don't be put off by the club's lower league status, this is real football with real fans and you'd be surprised at the quality of football played on matchdays.

So do you fancy seeing some proper local football? Why not pop along one week and get swept away by the atmosphere where you can expect to hear a cracking vocal support from the 'Rabble' (listen out for their take on Spandau Ballet's Gold).

Tickets are affordable with great concessionary rates. Plus every penny goes back into the running of the club to help them in their search for even greater success!
