'Amazing, inspired, exciting and fun'. Just some of the words that kids and parents used to describe a jam packed half term activities week at Big Creative Academy in February. WM Big Local teamed up with the NXT Creatives programme which offers young people the chance to explore their creativity, get active and try out new things. February's activities included indoor climbing at Yonder, graphic design skills with Apple technology and making beats. For a Big Local special activity we tasked the 10-14 year olds to become journalists and asked them to completely re-imagine our newsletter and create a youth edition. The ideas that the young people had were totally inspired with comics, drawings as well as articles on Lloyd Park, game addiction, what's going on in the area, and how to create a vision board. The submissions are going to be put together with a small editorial team of young people to help with the final designing stage and the youth edition will be hitting your doorstep soon!

Greener WM Big Local by Jo Wilson of FRP



Domestic gardens make up roughly half of an average city's green space. While back gardens are often well-looked after, it's easy for front gardens and balconies to become neglected. With growing evidence that exposure to nature can make people feel good, improving these prominent spaces is a significant opportunity.

William Morris Big Local has commissioned local charity Forest Recycling Project to run a pilot project. It will empower communities to transform grey, unloved front gardens and balconies into colourful, nature-rich spaces that brighten the days of all passers-by. To select the pilot locations, we analysed the ward, observing levels of footfall and visibility. We also surveyed residents of five shortlisted locations to gauge interest. For front gardens, we will work with residents of Queen Elizabeth Road, and for balconies, residents of Lloyd Park House.

We will fully support residents to participate in the pilot – no green fingers necessary! From developing the vision, to installing the plants, to looking after them (hopefully long into the future), the community will have a stake every step of the way. We will provide plants and containers in return, as well as knowledge, support and inspiration. We're also developing a facility for residents to borrow garden tools. While the project is about individual spaces, the final result will be greater than the sum of its parts. By creating a public meeting point and holding regular events, we will encourage people to share skills and ideas, celebrate their collective success and make their neighbourhood greener together. Although we're starting with one street and one block, we hope the project will go ward-wide.
