
New mural coming soon to William Morris Ward!

Everybody can have their say on the design of a new piece of local street art!


We are delighted to announce that we are supporting a really exciting street art project that is being carried out by Wood Street Walls.

Following a number of fantastic local murals painted over the past year by Wood Street Walls, they wanted to create a lasting artwork that gave us all a sense of ownership.

The new mural will be painted by ATMA, a Blackhorse Road resident, street artist, and a founding artist of Wood Street Walls. He will paint a portrait of William Morris combined with a Morris inspired pattern onto a property that overlooks the William Morris Gallery car park.



The wall will also be fully insulated by HEET, a Walthamstow based organisation that works with the elderly and those on low incomes to improve energy efficiency of their home. With artwork and insulation combined, Wood Street Walls want to demonstrate that energy efficiency can be both "Useful & Beautiful."

Thanks to funding from the Big Local a youth club was brought back to Priory Court Community Centre on the 17th March and since then over 50 young people have registered with the club and attended sessions. The club runs every Thursday and is run by Worth Unlimited. Activities include table tennis, football skills, drawing, interactive games, pizza making (and eating!) as well having a say in what additional activities take place there. A trip to a west end show is happening in August as well as a sailing course. There are still a few places up for grabs!

Worth Unlimited youth workers provide a safe supportive and friendly environment for our young people to relax, learn and socialise in.
