WMBL - YOURS, OURS, EVERYBODY'S

Big Local... what, who?

We are a community run organisation made up of local residents in the William Morris ward of Walthamstow. Like many places around here we share our name with the great designer and social activist William Morris, but contrary to what some might think we aren't part of the William Morris Gallery. Though we do love to visit it of course!

We've got the financial backing of a National Lottery Community Fund and use this to deliver and fund projects that improve our community. We also fund local groups and organisations that provide activities and opportunities for the area and we aim to benefit everyone that lives, works and plays here.

Our mission is to involve as many local people as possible in helping create positive change. Our projects to date have reached over 3,000 local people and we have just over 50 residents directly involved in the planning and organising of Big Local from ages 10 to 80.

Established in 2012 we are now over halfway through the Big Local programme and still have half of the original £1 million Lottery Community Fund awarded to the area. The next wave of funding is set to take us through to the end of 2025 and the completion of the Big Local programme.



We want to make sure that we invest the money on projects that mean the most to people, can have the biggest benefit to the area and can last beyond Big

Over the next few pages you can read about the areas of investment that we are considering. They have been developed through the work we've done to date, the successes and learnings we've had, and the community connections we've made since we began.

We've also learnt a lot over the last 12 months through the connections and work done during the coronavirus pandemic.

Laptops for families in need

We continue working with local schools to help families in need of computers. You can help us by donating your old working laptops, tablets and smart phones. Laptops should be under 6 years old and have more than 4GB memory and 250GB hard drive.

Blackhorse Station Bookshelves

Our local residents led by Kirstin Sibley applied for funding to revamp the bookshelves in the Blackhorse Road Station with new paint and planters. The shelves are filled and tidied regularly by volunteers. Blackhorse Road Station customer service assistant Gursh Bhalla has been an amazing help, 'It's really pleasant to see kids coming to get a book, say 'thank you' and go off happy.' We will continue funding small community led projects with small grants. If you have an idea how to improve your area and want to organise a group project, you too can apply for a grant.







Tool Lending Library is now open

The Tool Lending Library in 2a Priory Court has opened its doors for an additional day. From now on you can borrow tools & swap seeds on Tuesdays and Saturdays from 4-7pm.

It's the best time to spruce up your garden, try your hands on growing veg or build your own garden furniture. And we've got the tools for it.

Recently added items are hedge trimmers, circular saws and a long extension ladder of over 6m.

So what's the plan?

Our existing community plan has consisted of three main themes: Strengthening the Community, Improving Outdoor Spaces and Supporting the Local Economy. These themes have always been high on the list of things local people would like WMBL to focus on ever since our first community poll in 2012 through to opinions shared during the coronavirus pandemic. We suggest these themes continue to be our focus.



Help Alleviate Social Isolation

We've been acutely aware that social isolation is a real issue for our area. What if we were to provide:

- Community lunches & more social clubs
- Help for people to access and use technology
- Support to existing befriending schemes



Community Events

Bringing people together, creating connections and getting people involved.

- Priory Court Carnival
- Community Fun Days

A calendar of multicultural events led by our diverse community

Strengthen the Community

Community Grant Schemes

Our grant schemes have supported 70 projects for the area with over 2,000 participants. We suggest keeping our Community Chest Grants and Multicultural grants in place to support community led activities.

Capacity Building

We're going to find out how best we can support our local groups and charities to carry on the great work they do indefinitely.

Green Grants Scheme

We also aim to continue these and make grants of $\pounds 1,000 - \pounds 5,000$ available for local resident groups, community groups and organisations to improve outdoor spaces.

Improve Outdoor Spaces

Outdoor Health & Wellbeing We're asking what type of

We're asking what type of activities would help people connect with their outdoor spaces and increase wellbeing. So far the list includes:

- A Green Fair in Lloyd Park
 - Trails and guided walks
- Sports and games sessions
- Gardening and horticulture courses for beginners
- Seasonal workshops

Transforming dead spaces

There is a lot of grey in the area. We're looking at how to transform these into useful and beautiful spaces. What about?

- Mini parks here, there, everywhere
- More seating areas
- Working with LBWF to secure co-designed public realm improvements
- Transforming the garages at William Morris Close Greening the sea of grey outside Higham Hill Library



Tool Lending Library

Now fully up and running we want to ensure that the tool library can develop into a long lasting community facility to support growing, greening and the brightening up of the area.

THE PLAN

Enterprise Grants

Equivalent to our other small grant schemes we would make grants available for businesses to provide a community offer or try something innovative. Grants would also be made available for young entrepreneurs wanting to test their ideas out.

Support the Local **Economy**

Enterprise Advice, Guidance and Support

- Signposting businesses to specialist services and help in the area
- Workshops, masterclasses and events for local independent businesses and freelancers.
- Create an Enterprise Hub
- Coaching & mentoring for young locals provided by local business people.







Employability Programme

Traineeships, apprenticeships, and the creation of more work experience opportunities for local young people. Our partners at Big Creative Academy and East End Trades Guild would be instrumental in helping make this happen.





Supporting a Green Economy

The boom and bust economy is totally unsustainable and environmentally damaging. We want to encourage a new green based market that puts repair, remake, reuse and local supply chains at the heart of all our activity. Our approach still needs developing but ideas also include the brokering of a "green" hallmark for businesses to show they are environmentally sustainable and so gives residents an easy way to make environmentally based shopping choices.

Milla's family favourite: baking tray pizza

"This family recipe kept us going during the lockdown."

Prepare the base 12h before: 500g white bread flour 1 sachet/ 1.5tsp dried yeast ~350ml warm water

Sauce ingredients

1 onion finely chopped
2 garlic cloves, chopped
1 can passata
Pinch of basil / oregano
Season with salt & pepper

For oiling pan: ~1/2 dl oil

Topping:

Cheese, tomatoes... have fun and create your own mix!

Baking time about 15min in 250c middle of oven, until base is crispy.

Base: Mix the flour & yeast together in a mixing bowl, then mix in enough water to make soft dough. Cover with clingfilm and let it rise in a warm place 6-12 hours.

Sauce: Fry onions and garlic until soft, add passata and spices and let bubble until thick. Taste and season. Heat the oven to 250c.

Spread the oil on the sheet pan, remember to cover edges. Gently scoop the dough with oiled hands to pan and spread thinly, covering corners. Cover with sauce, then toppings. Bake until the base and edges are crispy and golden. Check that the pizza is ready by lifting corner with spatula. Enjoy!




