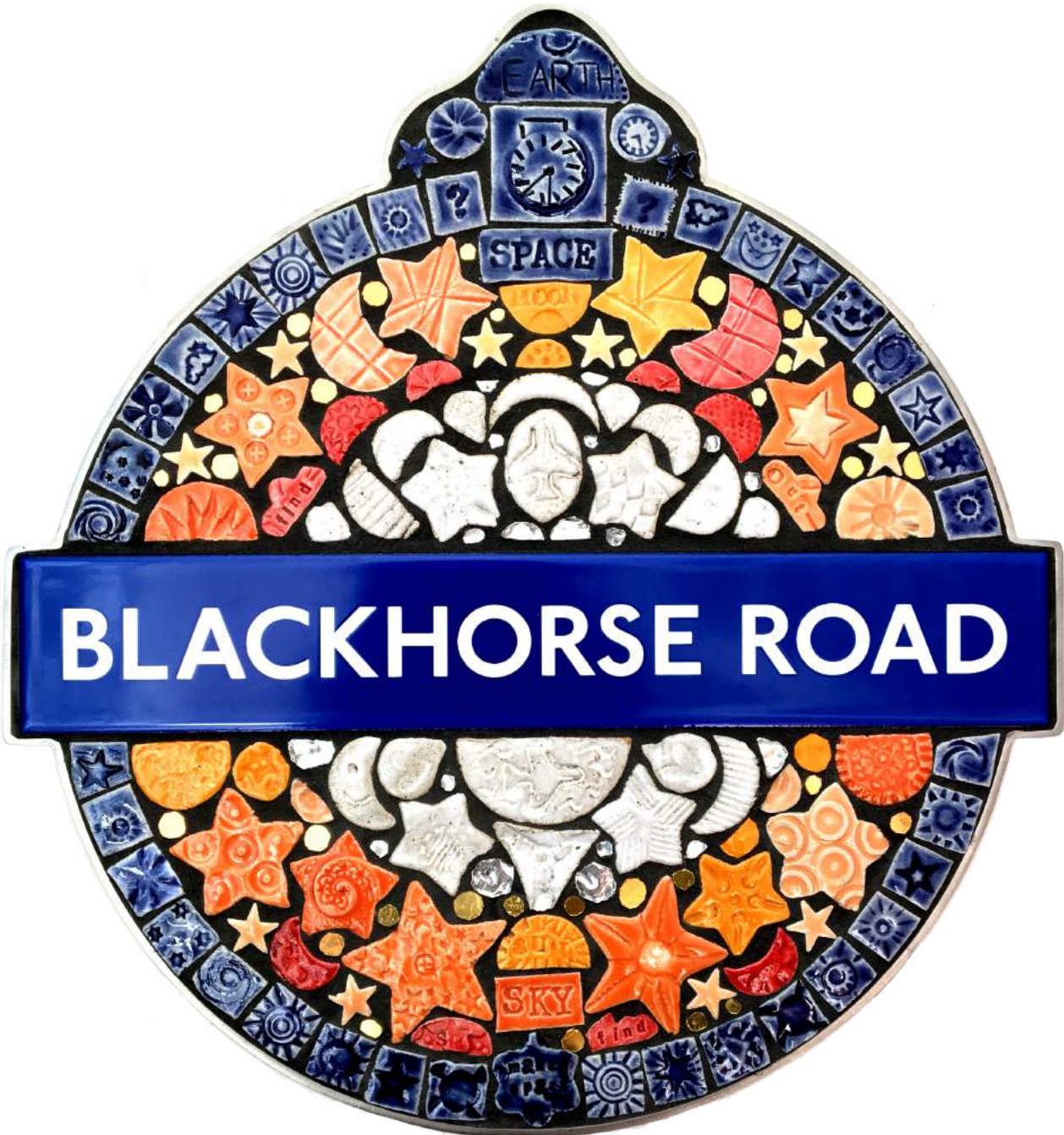

BLACKHORSE ROAD STATION MOSAICS



You may have noticed the beautiful mosaic roundel on the wall at Walthamstow Central station. We are happy to announce that the Blackhorse Road station will also have its own mosaic roundel, and many small ones to boot. Turn to page 2 to read more.

Blackhorse Road station mosaics are ready

Walthamstow artist Maud Milton (www.artyface.co.uk) is well known for creating the mosaics of the iconic London Overground roundel at South Tottenham, Highams Park, Walthamstow, Chingford, and Leyton stations among others

A new set of roundels have now been crafted and prepared for Blackhorse Road station. It will be the first time they feature in the London Underground. The roundels have been co-funded by William Morris Big Local, London Borough Waltham Forest, Taylor Wimpey and High Street Ward Councillor Funding.

The roundels at each station are specific to their location and they celebrate the local cultural, industrial and wildlife heritage.

The roundels will be installed at the station in December. A large roundel will be hung inside the station whilst a series of small roundels will be mounted on the concrete pillars at the rear entrance to form a mini gallery

Walthamstow Tool Library has now over 200 members with another 150 interested members who will sign up upon their first tool loan.

The free Tool Library events have been amazing this year, including herb walks, planter making workshops, willow basket making, cyanotype, balcony planter building, apple pressing and cider making courses.

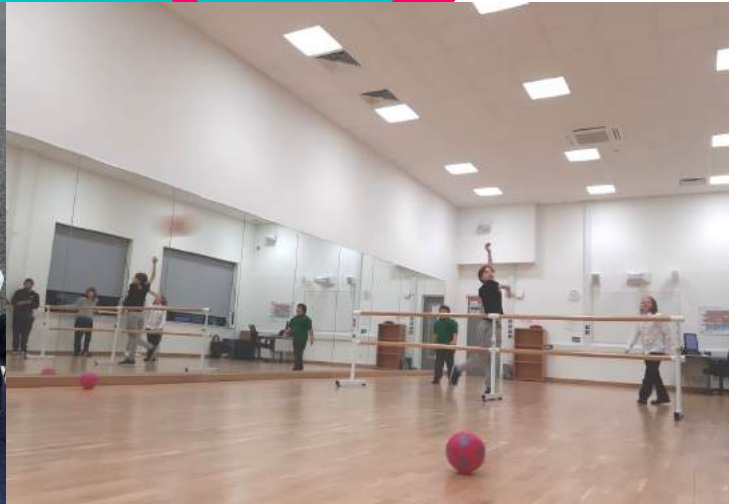

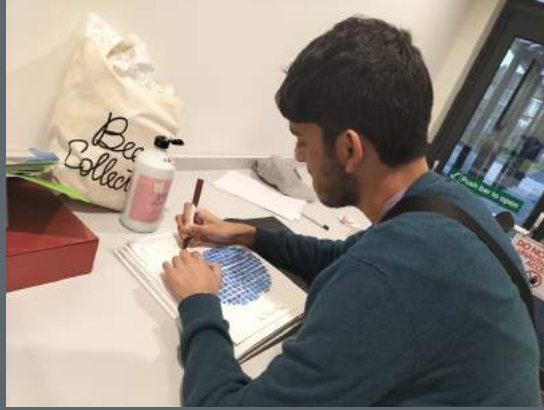

Mohammed Nasim Khan 12.12.1938 - 06.11.2022

Our community sadly lost a pillar on Sunday 6th November 2022, when Mohammed Nasim Khan died in London Royal Hospital due to a Cardiac Failure. Mr Khan had been in ICU for four weeks after a fall from the top of the stairs.

Mr Khan's talents were many. He was a beloved husband and father, and a community volunteer.

His contributions to the lives of many include being a William Morris Big Local Partnership member, a chairperson to Voluntary Action Waltham Forest, and to the 50+ Elderly Asian Club.

Mr Khan organised computer classes for the elderly, exercise classes, health seminars, and cultural events for the community.

Mr Khan was also involved with the Day Care Centre, William Morris community and helped with the Rukhsana Khan Foundation foodbank.

Mr Khan was born in Pakistan 12.12.1938, and came to England in 1960. He worked as a Civil Engineer and a Councillor for Waltham Forest Borough.



William Morris Big Local will not be the same without him. Partnership chair Chrys Christy wished to say these words:

"Mr Khan embodied community spirit and was such a huge part of our community. It was a honour to work alongside Mr Khan in all our projects. He had so many ideas and was always talking about what else we could do. Mr Khan will be sorely missed and leaves a huge void in our lives."



Mr Khan was married to Late Rukhsana Khan, who sadly passed away in September 2013.

He is survived by three sons: Jahangir Khan, Tauqir Khan, and Balal Khan; two daughters: Nayma Moreea and Anser Khan; and fourteen grandchildren.

His legacy will live on in the hearts and minds of everyone he interacted with as well as those he reached but never met.
